

TOHS Baseball Emergency Action Plan

1. All coaches will be provided with copies of emergency consent forms and coaches will have them on their person at all times during all team activities. When the season has concluded the forms will be returned to the head coach to be destroyed. The J.V. and freshmen coaches will be provided with three extra packets to be handed out to pre-approved parent drivers. These packets must be collected after each trip.
2. Head coaches will be provided with medical kits and must have them present at all team events. It is the responsibility of the head coaches to ensure that these kits are up to date and full of supplies. No one will open the medical kit without the supervision of a head coach.
3. Coaches will maintain proper caution when dealing with blood, when rendering C.P.R. and or first aid, gloves will be worn at all times and will be properly disposed of.
4. Coaches will have their cell phones with them at all times.
5. Coaches will add the following phone numbers to their cell phones: Jimmy Stueve, Mary Ziegler
6. If a player is injured during a team activity the attending coach will be notified immediately. If the head baseball coach is not present then he will be notified immediately.
7. The attending preferably the head coach will call the injured player's parents and inform them of the situation.
8. The attending coach will ensure that an injury report is filled out the day of the injury and turned in to the Head Baseball Coach.
9. If a player has suffered a serious injury, the attending coach will notify emergency medical responders immediately. Upon notification of emergency responders the coach will administer C.P.R. / first aid as necessary until the emergency medical staff arrives. The attending coach will notify the parents of the injured player as soon as possible. Keep your report brief; relay the basics and where their son is being transported. If the injured player's parents are not present, then one of the coaches will go with the injured player and not leave his side until they are in the care of his parents. If the coach is alone at the event, then he will appoint another adult to stay with the injured player. The head baseball coach will be notified as soon as possible, and the head coach will notify the Athletic Director.
